Purpose of Role and Service

To assist in the collection and distribution of goods between the hospice, the shops network and private households including furniture

Key Activities

- To maintain a link between the Retail Centre and the shops.

- To load and unload vans and assist in general warehouse duties.
- To drive the van with due care and attention. To keep the van safe and secure at all times. Carry out daily checks on the van and report any faults or concerns to the Shop Manager
- To provide driving relief to cover annual leave and sickness
- To provide outstanding customer service at all times
- To have an understanding and promote Gift Aid to donors
- Adhere to St Elizabeth Hospice Health & Safety & Manual Handling Policies and Procedures and Driving at Work Guidance at all times

Organisational Responsibilities

- To work within the policies of the hospice and act within Care Standards at all times
- To uphold the hospice and individual team values at all times
- To ensure effective use of resources
- To participate in the hospice education programme and attend training courses as required
- To respect at all times the confidentiality of information covering patients, staff and volunteers
- To play an active part in the development and maintenance of good relationships with all who have business with the hospice
- To promote the hospice Philosophy of Care towards patients, relatives and visitors
- Generally to contribute towards ensuring a safe environment for all persons on the premises
- Because of the special nature of the hospice and its work you may on occasion be asked to undertake other duties to help maintain our high standard of care
