About us St. Elizabeth Hospice - Great Yarmouth & Waveney

St. Elizabeth Hospice has been providing palliative and end of life care to the community of East Suffolk since 1989. Our vision is that all in our community affected by a life-limiting illness are able to live fully and die with choice and dignity.

Since 2019, St Elizabeth Hospice have been working together with East Coast Community Healthcare (ECCH) delivering services from Beccles and into surrounding Great Yarmouth & Waveney community to support the care and treatment of residents living with a life-limiting illness.

Together we provide palliative care medical and nurse consultant support at home, in day care facilities, and at Beccles and the James Paget University Hospitals. Our presence at the Louise Hamilton Centre in Gorleston offers spiritual and emotional well-being in addition to bereavement support.

Referrals are accepted for patients over 18 years of age with a life-limiting or progressive illness and can include support for family members. The service also offers medical in reach support into the James Paget University Hospitals, emotional wellbeing and bereavement support as well as having a dedicated presence at the Louise Hamilton Centre, Gorleston, with future ambitions to run further services from here.



Louise Hamilton Centre

The services we provide in this area

-  **Specialist consultant support to six palliative care beds at Beccles Hospital**
-  **In reach support into James Paget University Hospitals**
-  **Access to our 24 hour specialist palliative care advice line, OneCall, for patients, relatives and healthcare professionals**
-  **A community nursing specialist service during working hours**
-  **Day care services and outpatients at Beccles**
-  **Hospital for one day a week, including counselling and therapies**

Since launching in April 2019, more than 1,000 patients, living with conditions such as cancer, heart failure, pulmonary hypertension and neurological disorder, and their families, have received free care through the partnership between St Elizabeth Hospice and ECCH.

This care has been delivered via the joint initiative's varied specialist care provision available at Beccles Hospital, in the community and through the service's 24 hour advice line, OneCall.

The hospice's ambition is to expand its provision of free specialist palliative care to more people living with life-limiting conditions in these communities, as part of a partnership with East Coast Community Healthcare (ECCH).



Case Study

We need your support to do it!

One local resident who received this service was Rebecca Clegg, of Southwold in Suffolk, and her family explain why the support both Rebecca and they received was so vital during difficult times.

“We were treated with respect and our individual situations were understood,” explains Rebecca’s daughter Erika Clegg.

“It was a personable service from start to finish with the St Elizabeth Hospice and ECCH team leading the care process organisation with great simplicity, which enabled myself to focus on being there for mum which is what really mattered.”

Having previously been cared for in hospital, over the course of a number of months, Rebecca began her care with the hospice on 16th January this year, which saw her being cared for in her Southwold home before passing away, aged 71 later that month.

Erika added: “It really was a breath a fresh air for mum and myself when she entered the hospice service, as their support had continuity and you got to know the same faces which made you feel comfortable and relaxed which is very hard to do during that time.

“They always have time for you and there is no such thing as an odd question, as they answer with understanding as well as providing practical advice.

“Acknowledging a loved one is entering into the palliative stage is difficult but the clinical nurse specialists made this transition so much easier and it is reassuring to know you are in safe hands.”

For Rebecca it was important to her that she was able to pass away at home surrounded by family in an environment she felt safe and this is exactly what the St Elizabeth Hospice and ECCH team facilitated.

“Mum died at home with kind people around her and that is what she wanted,” said Erika.

“In contrast my dad had died six years previously in hospital, which was necessary at the time, but the passing we were able to give mum was far greater in quality, it felt more human and a strong sense of love and warmth was present.

“After mum’s passing, the care from St Elizabeth Hospice didn’t stop there. As they contacted me within a few days to see how I had been and to advise of further support the hospice could offer if I required, such as counselling and bereavement support.

“It’s clear to me there is a real sense of generosity behind all who work for the service, they don’t cut corners and they aim to meet the wishes of those under their care.

“To move into the palliative care system seems daunting but I encourage others out there in a similar position to mum, or their families, to not delay and to contact the St Elizabeth Hospice and ECCH service. They are here to help and they understand how to support people during the hardest of times.”



-  Each month, we receive over 2,000 calls of which over 300 are from Great Yarmouth & Waveney.
