Mini Challenges

Set yourself a mini challenge. Get sponsorship for committing to walking a mile a day until the big challenge. Get your family involved. Encourage the kids to get sponsors for walking up and down the stairs 500 times in a week.

Social media

Use social media to share your giving page. Ask for support from your friends and family to spread the word on their social media channels. Organise a guess the amount of sweets in a jar competition via Facebook.

Hold a cake sale

Organise a quick and easy event like a weekly cake sale at your work place, school or group. Ask your colleagues and friends to bake as well. Everyone loves a treat!

Organise a raffle

Who doesn't love to win something? Ask local businesses and people you know to donate prizes like wine, chocolates or vouchers for restaurants or shops, and charge £1 per ticket.

Use your sponsor form

Set up a giving page and share it!
